



IWS is grassroots educational initiative that brings together women surfers to create spaces of peer teaching, learning, and mutual aid. Our program is free. Please see the website for applications, information, and to learn about Skill Shares.

Our inaugural meeting will explore the topic of collaboration between women with emphasis on creating new and enduring bonds. Surf activists report that much surf work in the UK pits women surfers against one another. The gender climate creates competition between women for scarce resources, as women vie for acceptance in surf industry and surf media. "Collaboration" as a theme aims to build relationships and strengthen women's collective powers.
